




This Bucket includes one of our most important mission. That of youth development300 applications received so far for the 2019 programs. Best start ever!

• Whatever the age, background, skills, we now have a trip that is a good fit for everyone.





























Luke 10:25

On one occasion, an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?"



Our Questions and Jesus' questions are often very different. Why did this guy ask this question? Who knows. There are all kinds of motivations that could be inserted here. For me affirmation, insecurity,

Jesus asks him how he reads the law? He answers with the Sh'ma AND Lev 19. This was not a normal connection indicating that he had heard Jesus previously and repeated what Jesus had said. Okay, cool....

But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"




Sometimes we just can't leave well enough alone can we?

or like Luke says, he wanted to justify himself



...Whatever his motive, it was like Jesus says.. you want to go there now? Alright, with a smile, let's really unpack this...



A priest (evangelist) happened to be going the same way A Levite (Elder) when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.







But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him.

Imagine the hatred between Serbs and Muslims in modern Bosnia, the enmity between Catholics and Protestants in Northern Ireland or the feuding between street gangs in Los Angeles or New York, and you have some idea of the feeling and its causes between Jews and Samaritans in the time of Jesus. Both politics and religion were involved. Lots of history-Centuries of mutual rejection, fighting, and re-infroced prejudiced.

The Samaritan is the one who is able to rise above the bigotry and prejudices of centuries and show mercy and compassion for the injured Jew after the Jew's own countrymen pass him by!

After the separation of Judah and Israel in the ninth century, King Omri of the Northern Kingdom bought the hill of Samaria from Shemer (1 Kings 16:24). He built there the city of Samaria which became his capital.

It was strong defensively and controlled the valley through which the main road ran between Jerusalem and Galilee. In 722 B.C. the city fell to the Assyrians and became the headquarters of the Assyrian province of Samarina. While many of the inhabitants of the city and the surrounding area of Samaria were led off into captivity, some farmers and others were left behind. They intermarried with new settlers from Mesopotamia and Syria.

The fact that there was such dislike and hostility between Jews and Samaritans is what gives the use of the Samaritan in the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:29-37) such force! The Samaritan is the one who is able to rise above the bigotry and prejudices of centuries and show mercy and compassion for the injured Jew after the Jew's own countrymen pass him by!

Go and Do Likewise

I want our final thoughts NOT to be Jesus question. But rather what is to be our answer? Our actions and expectations from Jesus' question and words...
